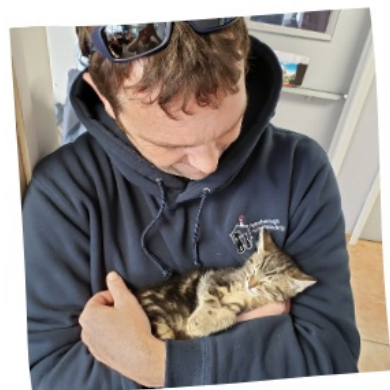
Dear PHS Supporter,

How much the world has changed in just a few short weeks! Like any other business, we've had to pivot and pivot again to ensure that we do what is best for our animals, staff and community.

On Monday, March 16th, we made the decision to suspend our volunteer programs and close our shelter's doors to the public in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. At that stage we still did a few low contact adoptions. By March 27th we realized that as much as we would love to see our animals go to amazing new homes sooner rather than later, we need to do what we can to protect our team and community and to help flatten the curve. In consultation with our partners in animal welfare at the Ontario SPCA and Humane Society and other affiliates, we decided to suspend adoptions for the time being.

The mass cancellation of upcoming events has also had a significant impact on our bottom line and fundraising plans for the year. Many of our supporters, such as Delta Bingo, have had to cancel their fundraising events, and earlier this month we decided to cancel our FurBall Gala, our biggest annual fundraising event. We will be moving a lot of our fundraising plans to a virtual platform this year and will keep you posted on all our exciting plans!

Friend, I can assure you that despite all these changes and tough decisions, we remain positive. The loyalty and dedication of our team has been unwavering, and I cannot thank them enough. We only have a small team working in the shelter, and they continue to provide our animals with love, kindness and enrichment to make their time with us a home away from home.

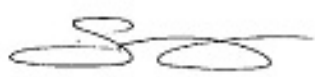


We do however, miss seeing our volunteers, adopters and regular visitors. The shelter feels empty without the many happy faces we are so used to seeing.

KEEP YOUR PETS COOL THIS SUMMER

Warmer weather is finally here and we're in for a hot, sunny day today! It's important to remember that our pets get hot too, which can easily lead to heatstroke.

Below are some fun tips to keep both yourself and your pets cool this summer.



KEEP YOUR PETS COOL THIS SUMMER



Hanging outside with your pooch? Ensure they have adequate shade. A tree, umbrella, canopy for example.



Walk in the early morning or evening hours to protect your pooches paws. (If it's too hot for your hands, it's too hot for their paws!)

Pools are fun, but ensure all splash time is supervised.



Get your dog a hair cut! Double coated dogs would benefit from regular brushings.



Make pup-sicles with yogurt, bananas, canned pumpkin, canned dog food, or other dog-friendly treats.



Always have cool, fresh water available.
